MISSISSIPPI LOAN ORIGINATOR LICENSE

Instructions

When changing employers, the following applies:

- You are required to surrender your license (MU4) through NMLS. All MU4 licenses are non-transferrable between employers. <u>If you go work for another company, you must surrender your current MU4 license and apply for another initial MU4 license.</u>
- Once the MS Department of Banking and Consumer Finance has updated your Loan
 Originator License to Terminated Surrendered/Cancelled, you must file an Initial MU4 with
 the new Employment History information of the new employer.
- The new employer is required to submit a "Sponsorship" request through NMLS to this agency <u>AFTER</u> a new Initial MU4 has been filed and the current MU4 license has been terminated. If the company submits a Sponsorship Request before your current license (MU4) with another company is terminated, the company will be charged \$131 and another \$231 will be charged when the Initial MU4 is filed. The "extra" \$131 from the Sponsorship Request filed before the Initial MU4 is filed is NOT REFUNDABLE.
- Change the relationship of the Loan Originator to the new employer and the specific location (branch, main office, etc) that he/she will be employed.
- Meet all of the requirements of an Initial MU4 license application as outlined in the NMLS Loan Originator Checklist.
- Confirm that the email address listed in the following locations is current in NMLS:
 - Home Tab>My Account>Update User Profile
 - Filing Tab>Individual>Identifying Information
